One waiver must be signed per camping unit and is valid for all registered campers within that camping unit as listed below as the attendee.

This Waiver must be carefully read and signed in consideration of the opportunity of being willing Attendee(s) permitted to enter the Premises. As used herein, the term "Releasees" is defined to include the following: The Campground, its subsidiaries, affiliated organizations, owners, members, managers, directors, officers, past and present employees, agents, representatives, successors and assigns.

2019 NOVEL CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) ACKNOWLEDGEMENT AND ASSUMPTION OF RISK

1. We are not currently experiencing COVID 19 symptoms nor have we had COVID-19 symptoms in the last 14 days.
2. We have not travelled outside of Canada or to an area under a travel health advisory in the last 14 days.
3. We have not provided care or had close contact with any person with COVID-19 or with any person reasonably suspected of having COVID-19 or with any person who travelled outside of Canada in the last 14 days or with any person who travelled in an area under a travel health advisory in the last 14 days.
4. We represent and warrant to the Releasees that we have not been advised by the Government of Canada or British Columbia Public Health Authority or my doctor or the British Columbia Ministry of Health website to self-isolate due to possible exposure to COVID-19.
5. We are fully aware of the risks and hazards with respect to COVID-19 inherent in attendance at the Premises and participation in the activities of the Campground.
6. We freely and voluntarily agree to assume the risk with respect to COVID-19, including the risk of illness, death, bodily injury or property damage, regardless of severity, that we may sustain as a result of participation in the activities of the Campground or attendance at the Premises, howsoever arising, including, but not limited to, the active or passive negligence of the Releasees.

2019 NOVEL CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) CODE OF CONDUCT

7. You and those camping on your site must be from one household unit. Households are defined as those people that live in one home and have maintained social distancing during the Covid-19 outbreak together.
8. Household groups must always maintain 2-metre (6 feet) separation from anyone else at the campground, on the nature trails or when in town.
9. Parents must ensure that their children maintain a 2-metre (6 feet) separation at all times from other children/people from other parties during your stay.
10. You and those camping on your site will not participate in or host a social gathering of more than 6 people while on the campground premises of any type or size.
11. You and those camping on your site will wash hands for at least 20 seconds in warm water and soap every time they enter or exit your RV unit. Please consider washing your grocery and beverage packaging followed by 20 seconds of handwashing.
12. Practice cough etiquette. Cough into your elbow or cover your mouth and nose with a disposable tissue when you sneeze. Immediately dispose of all used tissues in an appropriate waste bin and wash your hands right away
13. In suspected cases of COVID-19, it is important to call ahead to the hospital, doctor or urgent care centre first for advice. Symptoms of COVID-19 include, but are not limited to: fever, cough, sore throat, fatigue and difficulty breathing.
14. If you suspect you might have COVID-19 symptoms, you should call 811 for further assessment and necessary testing. You will need to provide health-care professionals with the following info: Symptoms; Where you have been travelling, working or living; If you had close contact with a sick person, especially with symptoms described above.
15. If anyone in your RV/Household group have any symptoms of covid19 (regardless of severity) they are to self isolate at their Home/RV until they meet all 3 requirements: a minimum of 10 days has passed AND their symptoms/fever stopped AND they feel better.
16. All persons arriving in Canada from abroad must quarantine and self-monitor for symptoms for 14 days under the Quarantine Act. You must complete and submit a self-isolation plan as per Government of BC prior to arrival.
17. You are aware of facility closures including the swimming pool & playground. These facilities will reopen if/when approval from Interior Health and the City of Kimberley are received.
18. Entry to facilities including the washrooms and office are limited & you agree to follow posted signage to ensure adherence. You agree that spent in common areas such as washrooms, laundromat and the office will be limited to prevent exposure.
19. Quiet time is from 11pm to 8am and any noise between these hours will be quiet and not disturb other campers or neighbors.
20. Pets will be leashed at all times when on the property and will not left unattended outside at the campsite. Please pick up after your pets.
21. Charges will be applied for any messy campsites that require garbage removal, pet waste cleanup or excessive amounts of cleaning.

We understand that there are inherent risks involved in participating in any of the activities of the campground or while attending the premises. We have read this document in its entirety and fully understand its terms. We understand that we are giving up substantial legal rights by signing below, including the right to sue Releasees. We acknowledge that we are signing this agreement freely and voluntarily and intend my signature to be a waiver complete and unconditional release of all liability to the negligence of the releasees or, the inherent risks of participating in the activities of the campground or while attending the premises.

I am signing on behalf of all attendees of my campsite/unit and agree to the code of conduct and acknowledge and accept the assumption of risk as outlined above.
